Task Force 501's Solar Lamp Project Brightens Ainod Village: Lighting the Future of Papua

PAPUA- The 501 Task Forces of the Para Raider Infantry Battalion 501/Bajra Yudha Kostrad, deployed under the Indonesian Armed Forces Operational Command HABEMA, have brought new light literally and symbolically to the residents of Ainod Village. As part of a community outreach program titled "Bright Papua," the task force installed solar-powered lamps throughout residential areas and public roads on Sunday, October 27, 2024.
